

## Portrait of a Lady on Fire Portrait De La Jeune Fille En Feu (15) FRI 20 – THU 26 MAR

France | 2019 | 122mins | French and Italian with subtitles

**Director** Céline Sciamma

**Starring** Noémie Merlant, Adèle Haenel, Luàna Bajrami

Romance and art entwine in a sumptuous new masterpiece from Céline Sciamma (*Tomboy, Girlhood*). Set in late 18th century France, painter Marianne (Noémie Merlant) is commissioned by an affluent countess to paint the wedding portrait of her sheltered but headstrong daughter Héloïse (Adèle Haenel), in the hope it will find her a wealthy husband. While posing as her hired companion, Marianne is instructed to complete the portrait in secret, observing Héloïse by day and painting her by night. However, as the two women grow closer, their intimacy and attraction begins to blossom, paving the way for a simmering, star-crossed romance. A heartbreaking period piece with a distinctly modern feminist energy unfolds.

In Daniel Craig's fifth outing as Bond, we find him having left active service and enjoying a tranquil life in Jamaica. His peace is short-lived when his old friend Felix Leiter from the CIA turns up asking for help. The mission to rescue a kidnapped scientist turns out to be far more treacherous than expected, leading Bond onto the trail of a mysterious villain armed with dangerous new technology.





## True History of the Kelly Gang (18)

Based on Peter Carey's Booker Prize winning novel, Justin Kurzel's *True History of The Kelly Gang* shatters the mythology of the notorious icon to reveal the essence behind the life of Ned Kelly. Hero to some, outlaw to others, Kelly (played by 1917's George MacKay) throws a long shadow over a specific period of Australian history. Spanning the younger years of Ned's life to the time leading up to his death, the film explores the story behind this legendary historical figure. Youth and tragedy collide in the Kelly Gang, and at the beating heart of this tale is the fractured and powerful love story between a mother and son.

Initially sceptical and embarrassed by such an amateur bunch, newcomer Lisa (Sharon Horgan), a rebel and rocker to the core, is quickly transformed by the choir's friendship, humour and courage. Finding their voice together, Kate, Lisa and the choir put aside their own personal differences and, by belting out pop hits and rock anthems, this extraordinary group of women sing their hearts out...

When the Austrian peasant farmer is faced with the threat of execution for treason, it is his unwavering faith and his love for his wife Fani and children that keeps his spirit alive. Set against the majestic backdrop of the Austrian Alps, critics have hailed *A Hidden Life* as Malick's finest film in years.

The knights encounter some increasingly silly obstacles on their quest, including a persistent Black Knight, a three-headed giant, a cadre of shrubbery-challenged knights, the perilous Castle Anthrax, a killer rabbit, a house of virgins, and a handful of rude Frenchmen.

John Cleese, Terry Gilliam, Eric Idle, Terry Jones and Michael Palin play a dazzling array of characters, including ex-lepers, Pontius Pilate, revolutionaries, crazy prophets, religious fanatics and Roman centurions.

To save his reputation, he decides to bounce back with a highly publicised and extravagant party celebrating his 60th birthday on the Greek island of Mykonos.

This practice, rooted in military moves and Middle Age holiday celebrations, occupies the mind and body of Merab (dancer Levan Gelbakhiani in his first acting role), a sensitive and headstrong student at the academy. He's talented and a touch frustrated by the cultural structures inhibiting his livelihood. But he's still mostly in control of his ambition, until a rival dancer enters the equation and thaws his cool veneer with a threat.


